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Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 June 2023

The financial statements cover Central Australian Rough Riders Incorporated ("Association") as an individual entity. Central Australian Rough Riders Incorporated is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in the Northern Territory under the Associations Act (NT) 2003 ('the Act').

The functional and presentation currency of Central Australian Rough Riders Incorporated is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the Act and the following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, They have not been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1997.

(b) Revenue and other income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Grant revenue

Grants are recognised at fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all grant conditions will be met. Grants for capital projects are recognised in line with the capital expenditure relating to the grant program. The unspent amount is recognised as a liability on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities.

Membership and race entry fees

Membership and race entry fees relate to receipts from members and non members for club memberships and individual races and are recognised on a cash basis when the Association receives them.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Other income

Other income is recognised on an cash basis when the Association is entitled to it.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The Association is not registered for GST.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Central Australian Rough Riders Incorporated (the Association), which comprises the statement of assets and liabilities as at 30 June 2023, the statement of profit or loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report of the Association for the year ended 30 June 2023 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the *Associations Act (NT) 2003*.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

As is common for organisations of this type, it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of race fees, event fees, memberships and other income prior to their entry into the accounting records.. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to these sources of revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We are therefore unable to express an opinion on the completeness of income of the Association.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards) (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 of the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Association in meeting the reporting requirements of the *Associations Act (NT) 2003*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the reporting requirements of the *Associations Act* (*NT*) 2003, and for such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Information Other than the Financial Report and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Committee are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Committee's Report for the year ended 30 June 2023, but does not include the financial report and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.
